Your link to services is our Transition Outreach Specialists (TOS) who will:

- · Serve as the Primary contact for the program.
- · Attend Individual Education Plan (IEP) staffing as part of each student's interdisciplinary team.
- · Work with special education department staff to ensure the transition is part of the IEP.
- · Develop and maintain linkages between families, special education staff and adult service providers.
- · Provide an in-service training and coaching sessions for parents, guardians and students.
- Advocate for and assist in establishing eligibility for community services, such as employment, life skills training, residential services, and respite.
- Facilitate participation of students in seasonally offered Adult Transition Experiences to prepare them for adult services.


