- Special Olympics has returned to UCP Seguin! After a long hiatus, athletes supported by UCP Seguin are once again participating in the Special Olympics Illinois program. Our Track & Field and Bowling teams had successful seasons, and we're excited to cheer on our Basketball team this fall. We celebrate the determination and spirit of every athlete involved.

  have received support with their mental health, financial stability, access to housing and food, and parenting

#### UCP Seguin: Building Bridges to the Future

Graduating high school should feel exciting, not overwhelming. But for families of students with disabilities, graduating brings a maze of forms, court hearings, and wait lists that often delay adult services like a Community Day Program or vocational training.

That's where UCP Seguin's Building Bridges to the Future team steps in. Transition Outreach Specialists—Maria, Nancy, and Veronica—have the expertise needed to navigate these issues alongside families to ensure a smooth transition through milestone events and changes within the family. Each year, this team helps more than 200 families across Cook and DuPage counties as they navigate guardianship, applying for Medicaid, and waiting lists for funding and services.

These processes can be especially difficult when English isn't a family's primary language. All three Transitions Outreach Specialists speak both Spanish and English fluently and offer interpretation services. "They are just so relieved that someone will help them in their language," Nancy shared. Helping families in this way is important to her as the daughter of immigrants. "This could have been my mom or dad."

Nancy added, "We try to see every angle of the situation to make sure families are protected in every way."






